
Ten Star Hotel for kids

APPROXIMATE TIME REQUIRED: 3 hours

GROUPING: Pairs or groups of three



THE TASK

To put forward the best ideas for a luxury and fun hotel for children.

INTRODUCING THE ACTIVITY

Explain that they are working in teams and that the winning team will be the team with the best ideas for the way the hotel would be set up. Explain that they need to come up with really unusual and fun ideas to win.

Explain to pupils that the hotel ideas need to be realistic. You can't defy gravity, travel in time or transport people through air for example! Ask pupils to start by listing all the things they think they would like to include in their hotel.

Ask pupils to produce the following:

- 1. A name for the hotel.
- 2. A description and picture of the foyer and what happens there. Explain to pupils that you would want the foyer to have impact and to give a very startling first impression.
- 3. A picture (with labels) of how the children will get to their rooms.
- 4. A picture and description of one of the rooms with all fun and luxurious features labelled and described.
- 5. A list and description of all the other things that children can do while they are staying in the hotel. This could be produced in a leaflet format.

Pupils then need to present their proposals to the rest of the class and the class can vote to decide which hotel they think they would most like to stay in.

EXTENSION

Pupils could:

- Design a brochure for the 'winning' hotel proposal.
- Consider the staff this hotel would need to employ and list all the jobs that would need doing.

Ten Star Hotel for kids

Your task

You have been asked to help change a large, run down hotel into a ten star hotel for kids. This will be an absolutely luxurious and fun experience for any child that comes to stay in this hotel. The people who will be running the hotel are going to advertise it to encourage nine to eleven year olds to stay there. It costs a lot of money to stay in this hotel but once a child has paid, everything inside is free.

What you need to consider:

1. The name of your hotel

- What would be a really good name for such a hotel?
- Will the name some how tell you that the hotel is luxurious and for children?

2. The hotel's foyer

- What will children be greeted by when they first walk into the hotel?
- How will the children book into the hotel?
- What will any staff in the fover do?
- How will the children be told of all the things they can do in the hotel? ...

3. The route to the bedrooms

- Will there be a lift or some other form of transport?
- Will it be a fun journey?

4. The bedrooms

- What will the beds be like in the rooms?
- What will the view be like from the window (any special features here)?
- What luxurious and fun things will be included in the rooms?
- What will the bathroom be like?
- How will the children be able to get anything they need and what might be on offer?

5. Other activities in the hotel

- In the other parts of the hotel, what will the children also be able to find?
- What sports and games will be available in the hotel?
- Will there be a swimming pool and what will it be like?
- What eating places will there be in the hotel?
- *What services will the staff offer?
