





# Arctic animals sculpture, form, modelling, materials, construction

follow the pictures and try to make your very  
own Arctic Animal.



Can you name these Arctic animals?



Here are some examples of what you can make, however you can make any other arctic animal that you know. Have a look in your books or on the internet to find out about animals that live in cold countries.

Walrus

Polar bear



Seal

Penguin



Choose which animal you would like to make

You will need:

- \*Card the colour of your animal (or a card tube which you could paint the animal colour)
- \*scissors
- \*pencil
- \*ruler
- \*googly eyes (or draw eyes onto paper)
- \*coloured paper
- \*stapler (or double sided tape)
- \*felt tip pen
- \*a grown-up to help



1. Draw a straight line on the back of your card with a ruler and pencil



2. Cut carefully along the line, to create a rectangle, hold the scissors firmly,

3. Roll the rectangle to make a cylinder or tube shape. Ask your grown-up to staple the cylinder together. If you're using double-sided tape, stick the edges together now. If you're using a card tube paint it carefully and let it dry.




4. Draw the shape of the legs and flipper (or other body parts for the penguin, seal or polar bear).

5. Carefully cut out the pieces.

6. Fold a small part of the flipper and glue onto the back of the cylinder tube.

7. Glue the legs onto the side of the body.





8. For the walrus, draw tusks on white paper, make sure they are long and pointed!



9. Carefully cut out the tusks.

10. Glue onto the front of the walrus.

11. Use a felt-tip pen to draw a nose, mouth and whiskers.



12. Glue the googly eyes in place or draw eyes on paper, cut out and glue.



Brilliant! Your Arctic animal is complete!  
You could make a different animal using the same technique,  
but add different body parts.
