Suddenly, from out of nowhere, the sound of a rushing mighty wind filled the room. The disciples and new believers saw something that looked like flames of fire resting just above each person's head! They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and they began to speak in other languages! The noise from the wind, and from the praying, and from all the people speaking at the same time was so loud that people outside on the street down below were beginning to wonder what in the world was happening up there in that room! People came

from all around to find out what all the commotion was about. They were amazed and thought it was marvellous that they were hearing people speaking in their own language, because they knew that the people in the room were all from Galilee and didn't know any other language except their own. Peter stood up and started to preach to all the people standing outside. He explained that what they were seeing and hearing was the power of the Holy Spirit.
