Pentecost

On Monday morning, Reverend Jeff took the lead during our whole school Pentecost service in church. The children sang beautifully and enjoyed sharing their ideas during Reverend Jeff's talk. A group of Year 6



pupils shared the story of the coming of the Holy Spirit from the book of Acts. Pentecost occurred 50 days after Easter Sunday, 50 days after Jesus rose from the dead. Jesus had already ascended to Heaven so the disciples and new believers of Jesus were waiting to receive the Holy Spirit because that's what Jesus told them would happen.

Can your child retell the story of Pentecost?

Suddenly, from out of nowhere, the sound of a rushing mighty wind filled the room. The disciples and new believers saw something that looked like flames of fire resting just above each person's head! They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and they began to speak in other languages! The noise from the wind, and from the praying, and from all the people speaking at the same time was so loud that people outside on the street down below were beginning to wonder what in the world was

happening up there in that room! People came from all around to find out what all the commotion was about. They were amazed and thought it was marvellous that they were hearing people speaking in their own language, because they knew that the people in the room were all from Galilee and didn't know any other language except

their own. Peter stood up and started to preach to all the people standing outside. He explained that what they were seeing and hearing was the power of the Holy Spirit.

Reverend Jeff asked us what 'energy' is? A few children gave examples of energy from our everyday lives. This included having the power to run and jump, photosynthesis, fuel in a car and electricity.

Reverend Jeff shared examples of food that give us energy, like bread and breakfast cereals. He showed us some ears of wheat. To illustrate the energy/power of electricity, he used a toaster to toast a piece of bread. Sitting in the pews, the children were unable to see the power in the toaster until the toasted bread popped up and the bread had changed colour. Reverend Jeff also struggled to hold the toast due to the heat! Just the like the power of the Holy Spirit in the lives of Christians, the toaster changed the bread.

How would you like the power of the Holy Spirit to touch your life? How will you use your energy to let your light shine this week?

Christians believe that Jesus breathes life into His people to make them people of God. He gives them the power and energy to follow in His footsteps.
