Prayers for Reverend Andrew Williams

As we prepare to welcome Reverend Andrew Barrington Williams as our new vicar, please take a moment to pray for him. On Saturday 21st October, at 3pm, the Bishop of Lancaster and Archdeacon of Lancaster will lead the service of induction and institution at St Michael's Church, Grimsargh. A huge thank you to the children who have volunteered to read prayers and/or sing during tomorrow's service.

Do you know the story of 'The Fall'? Why is it important for Christians?

On Monday, the children enjoyed listening to a Bible story from the book of Genesis. Three children kindly helped to bring the story of Adam and Eve to life. God created the world and it was perfect but something happened and it wasn't perfect any more.



Can your son/ daughter tell you what happened?

God created a beautiful, perfect world. He asked Adam and Eve to do one thing. They decided that they knew better. Sadly, they ate the forbidden fruit from the large tree in the centre of the Garden of Eden. Their relationship with God was damaged. Christians call this part of God's big story, 'The Fall.'

Why is the story important for Christians?

The story of 'The Fall', describes the word 'sin'. Adam and Eve thought they knew better than God. God wants Christians to have Him at the centre of their lives. Christians believe that God made them, created them but He also gave them free will to do what they want in life. Bishop Phillip explained that sin is when we do things our own way, instead of God's way. The children talked about examples of humans doing things their own way, instead of God's way. They gave examples of people talking about other people in a negative way, gossiping, telling lies, destroying God's creation by dropping litter, polluting the oceans, conflict and war.

Lisa Fenton and Bishop Phillip from Blackburn Diocese, explained the significance of this story, pointing out that Christians don't have a solution to sin themselves, they needed a rescuer and believe that God sent Jesus to rescue them after The Fall. Christians believe that Jesus died for them, to take away their sin.

So what?

We can make a difference and make the world a better place, just as God wants it to be.

'What Parents and carers need to know about EA Sports FC'.

This free online safety guide profiles EA Sports FC 24, the spiritual successor to FIFA which is likely to be a similarly spectacular hit among young football fans.

For 20 years, FIFA dominated the football video gaming arena, attracting legions of devoted fans and scooping up accolades like a digital Real Madrid. After parting ways with the sport's governing body, however, renowned developers Electronic Arts (EA) have now launched their own individual bid for the title. It's called EA Sports FC 24, and its effectively FIFA 2.0.

Familiar action delivered by the same team, of course, points to a comparable level of popularity – especially among those young gamers raised on the FIFA franchise. As our #WakeUpWednesday guide highlights, however, EA Sports FC 24 also carries many similar risks to its predecessor, including addictive gameplay, abusive voice chats and expensive in-game purchases.


