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Maths

To start the term we will be initially continuing to look at multiplication and division. This will be followed by length and perimeter, fractions and then mass and capacity. You can help your child at home by making sure they practise their times tables facts regularly and complete maths homework as independently as possible. When they have completed the homework set, please talk to them about what they have done and how they have done it. The homework will be regularly set on Mathletics. And will consist of either 2 or 3 tasks each week, linked to what we have studied, or will be studying in class that week.

English

This half term our literacy work commences with persuasive writing, looking at adverts and finishing the unit with a persuasive letter. We will then look at poetry and work around the novel 'The Iron Man'. We will then look at instructions and explanations. As always, we will be encouraging children to spell and punctuate their work accurately. We will also be looking more closely at grammar, spelling and punctuation to ensure the children become more secure in these areas.

Reading

Please read with your child each day, some children will be reading independently now and completing reading challenges, so please talk to them about the stories they are reading. Reading books will be changed at least once a week and please try to make sure you sign and write when and what your child has read in their homework/ reading diary each time they do so. They will also get a library/class library book which can be changed when necessary. Guided reading sessions are also part of our weekly timetable; children are grouped by ability and will be taking part in group reading activities with in-depth discussions, writing activities and a range of interesting and exciting books. Children will normally be heard reading twice a week— once by the class teacher in guided reading time, and once by another adult.

Science

In science, we will be looking at soils, fossils, then health and nutrition followed up by beginning a topic on forces.

History

We will be looking at the achievements of early civilizations – an overview of the Iron Age, Stone Age and the Bronze Age. We will develop a chronologically secure knowledge and understanding of British, local and world history, establishing narratives within and across the periods studied.

Geography

We will be finishing off looking at climate zones and how do the climate zones influence the weather and seasons? We will use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate and describe features studied. We will then move onto locational knowledge with a particular focus on North America.

French

RE

Initially, we will be thinking about how Jesus as a man changed other peoples lives through his words, deeds and actions. Then we will be looking at the Easter story in detail. The intention is to examine how important this period is for Christians and how it brings both sadness and joy.

<u>Art</u>

We will be looking at sculpture linked to making clay iron man heads in connection with the English topic. The artist focus will be Illustrators of Iron Man. Also, we will be painting, with a particular focus on animal paintings. The artist focus will be on Thuline de Cock—this section will have a geography link.

<u>PE</u>

We will initially be swimming for the first 2 weeks— with these sessions taking place every day. After this period, we will be doing dance on Friday mornings and continuing with some gymnastics.

<u>Music</u>

We will be looking at making music using glockenspiels and recorders by improvising and composing for the first few weeks, then we will be working on music linked to our production.

Computing

On-line safety will be revisited as it is woven through our computing curriculum. We will also be looking at improving our typing skills and how to communicate via email.

PSHE

We will be looking at keeping safe, rights, respect and responsibilities, danger and risk and helping each other to stay safe. These lessons mainly involve lots of teamwork, discussion and some role play or drama.

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
