

Gideon- A Brave and Mighty Man





Gideon was the son of Joash, from the Abiezrite and lived in Ephra (Ophrah). As a leader of the Israelites, he won a decisive victory over a Midianite army despite a vast numerical disadvantage, leading a troop of 300 'valiant' men.

God did not give Gideon tens of thousands of soldiers, but he gave him a few kind soldiers and a clever brain/ mind so he could outwit the Midianites so almost nobody ended up dying.

What can we learn from this Bible story?

Bishop Phillip explained that Gideon needed to learn to put his trust in God and Gideon needed to learn to trust in the gifts that God had given him.

Christians believe that when they trust in God, He will never let them down. It's easy to put our trust in material items, in money, in weapons, in strength but Gideon teaches Christians to place their trust in God and the gifts that he has given them. Christians believe that if they use their God given gifts properly, then anything is possible.

Prayer Father God,

We pray that we will have the same trust in you that Gideon had.

That we will trust you in good times, confusing times and bad times.

We trust that you will always be with us and that you can do extraordinary things in our lives, just like you did for Gideon.

Teenagers' blossoming interest in romantic relationships and their devotion to online networking is a potent combination – and, regrettably, not always a safe one. It raises all kind of worries about the possibility of sharing intimate images or deeply personal information; and that's simply with contacts their own age – to say nothing of the chance of connecting with an older stranger.

MyLOL – a site which specifically facilitates interaction between 13 to 19-year-olds – has amassed around a million users worldwide, but sadly its safeguarding protocols can't match that level of success. The ease with which an adult could pose as a teen under a bogus birthdate makes grooming a realistic threat – and that's far from the platform's only risk, as our guide explains.



Mobile Phones

We are seeing a rise in the number of our pupils bringing a mobile phone into school. Please contact the school office if your child needs to bring their mobile phone to school.

The phone must be brought to the school office before the pupil enters school to start the day and must be collected, again via the main office, after school has finished.

Phones found, that have not been handed in, will be confiscated. Parents/ carers will be informed and will have to come to school to collect the phone.
