On the Worship Together video about this story, Bishop Phillip reminds us that the grief stricken disciples arrived at the inn and when Jesus broke the bread, they recognised Him but then He disappeared. The children talked

about the fact that the disciples were happy about this and not sad. Christians believe that this was because Jesus rose from the dead. His disciples knew that Jesus lived on in their hearts through the Holy Spirit. They did not need to see Jesus in human form any more. They believed that He was always with them.

Christians believe that when they pray, worship, praise and break the bread that Jesus is with them. They believe that Jesus rose from the dead and is alive forever through the Holy Spirit in good times and bad.

Christians know Jesus best of all when they gather for the Eucharist and they break the bread, eat it and drink the wine.




#### **Prayer**
